

Dear Parent/Guardian(s),

Northern Valley Old Tappan High School is offering an exciting new student support program. Title I is a federal program that allocates funding to local school districts in order to improve the academic achievement of students that perform on the lower range, particularly in English Language Arts and/or Mathematics. Qualifying students are eligible to receive these support services through one-on-one instruction and other online resources. Taking advantage of this opportunity may benefit their overall performance in the classroom, on standardized tests, and on post-secondary entrance exams.

Based on a combination of the criteria below, it was determined that your child is eligible to receive extra support in the following area(s):

The academic/social-emotional support your child receives will be specific to his/her needs. Your child will receive one-on-one instruction based on teacher/student availability before and/or after school and also during lunch. The length of these meetings can be either 30 minutes or one hour. If your child qualifies for the program and it is determined that additional social/emotional support would benefit their academic performance, they may also be eligible to meet with our student assistance counselor (SAC).

Student progress will be measured in a variety of ways, including Renaissance STAR literacy and math assessments, standardized assessments, teacher designed

assessments, and alternative assessment tools. In order to exit the Title I program, your child must meet the individualized goals determined for him/her upon entry into the program based on his/her individual needs, and based on the assessments described above.
